





# How do Australia & New Zealand Compare Globally in Workplace Wellbeing?

According to the *Gallup State of the Global Workplace 2025* report, Australia and New Zealand **lead the world** in life satisfaction and access to work opportunities. While these are impressive, we also rank as the **second-highest globally** for experiencing daily stress.

This high stress rate is a red flag, especially considering our historically strong well-being scores. Although we remain the **top global** 

performer in life satisfaction ("thriving"), the report notes a four percentage-point decline from previous highs. Housing affordability issues, inflationary pressures and economic uncertainty are cited as the key contributing factors.
